



In Cygnets this term children will be learning about the Celts

In Computing children will be learning to keep ourselves safe online. We will also be learning to use a mouse on a laptop with control.

In English we will be reading the story Cave Baby By Julia Donaldson where children will be making captions, labels and posters. Our second text for the term will be the Journey Home by Fran Preston-Gannon the children will have the opportunity to explore writing different styles of Posters, lists, postcards, wanted posters, information report, short stories

In PE reception and year one will continue their trips to Forest school. On a Monday Mr Woods will continue teaching all three year groups at the field they will be learning team building activities. On a Thursday the children will have multiskills.

In Science, children will learn about their bodies and how they move. Children will also learn about their five senses and what they are used for.

In Music children will be learning to perform songs. We will also be continuing to learn to play the ocarina.



Children will be having a whole Celt day at the woods further information to follow.

Celts

In Art we will be exploring colours and drawing detailed pictures of Celt using fine line and shading. In Design technology we will create various Celtic items. Children for their large DT piece will be creating a woven blanket.

In History children will be learning about the own personal history and events in their own past. We will then compare it against another persons perception of the past we will then discover things that are the same and different.

In RE, children will explore the Christian story of Creation from Genesis 1:1–2:3, learning to retell it in simple terms. They will begin to understand that this story marks the start of the Bible's 'big story' and consider what it teaches Christians about God, Creation, and the world. Children will also learn how Christians show their thankfulness to God for the world around them. Through discussion and reflection, they will be encouraged to think, talk, and ask questions about living in an amazing world, and to make connections between the Creation story and their own experiences.

In Reception, children will begin by learning to count forwards and backwards up to 5. The focus will then shift to developing a deeper understanding of the numbers 5, 6, and 7.

In Year 1, children will be working with numbers up to 20 and exploring place value using ten frames. They will then move on to learning about 2D and 3D shapes. To conclude the term, the focus will be on addition within 20.

In Year 2, children will use tens and ones to investigate and understand the structure of numbers. They will work with numbers up to 100, applying this knowledge to addition and subtraction activities.
